Designed by Wold Architects and Engineers, the \$2.1 million expansion triples of the size of the existing center and integrates all Hutchinson Health's cancer services into one location. The project adds three exam rooms, six infusion therapy rooms and a procedure room. In addition, the expansion features a new waiting room, consultation rooms, and spaces for pre and post procedure.

KRAUS-ANDERSON and Inland Development Partners have commenced construction on a three-story, 316-unit housing project in Richfield, Minn. Located near 66th and Cedar Ave., the \$53 million Chamberlain apartment complex is the first joint venture between the two companies, which both focus on developing and redeveloping multifamily, office, industrial and retail property.

A groundbreaking ceremony was held at 2:00 p.m., Thursday, July 19.

Designed by Urbanworks Architecture of Minneapolis, the Chamberlain apartment complex consists of six rental buildings – three will be new construction and three others will be renovated. Of the 316 mixed-income units, 20 percent of the units will be designated as affordable housing. "The City of Richfield staff and policy makers have been a meaningful partner in making the Chamberlain project a reality," said Steve Schwanke partner at Inland Development Partners.

The property was purchased from the City of Richfield. Richfield Parkway will be extended through the Chamberlain complex south from 66th Street to 70th Street.

"We are pleased to be a part of this exciting re-development, bringing additional vitality to the east edge of Richfield," said Matt Alexander, Kraus-Anderson's senior vice president of Kraus-Anderson Development Company.

The project was financed through the HUD 221(d)(4) program through the AFL-CIO Housing Investment Trust and placed by Dougherty Mortgage of Minneapolis.

Kraus-Anderson Construction is the general contractor. The first units will be open in the fall of 2019. ◆

the design, construction ad operation of high performance green buildings. The LEED Green Associate credential demonstrates green building expertise in non-technical fields of practice. Kraus-Anderson has dozens of employees who have earned the LEED designation.

Leading the charge in sustainable design and construction for the last 20 years, Kraus-Anderson has managed dozens of national LEED projects and has been ranked consistently among the top Green Contractors in the U.S. by Engineering News Record. ◆

Xcel Energy's High Performance Building Award has been presented to **KRAUS-ANDERSON** (KA), recognizing the company's new fivestory, 100,000-square-foot downtown Minneapolis headquarters. The award honors KA for its exemplified leadership and ongoing commitment to energy efficiency.

KA's new headquarters building is part of a block-wide development that includes high-rise housing, a boutique hotel, a non-profit micro-brewery and two levels of underground parking. The entire block was designed to create a unique urban experience within the heart of downtown that taken as a whole represents a sustainable addition to the City of Minneapolis.

KA worked with Xcel Energy's Energy Design Assistance (EDA) program to maximize energy saving opportunities that complemented the style and design of the space. The program provides computerized energy modeling to identify various efficiency measures available, potential costs, payback terms and rebates.





"Our company's leadership determined the guiding principle used throughout the project would be cost-effective sustainability. This principle influenced all decisions, including space planning for customers and employees, building components, systems and technology," said Matt Stringfellow, KA's mechanical and electrical systems manager. "Months of planning and construction has resulted in a beautiful, spacious and energy efficient building that we're proud to call home."

Attracting and retaining talent to the market was another goal.

"It's a very competitive market for talent right now," said Michael Hille, executive vice president of Kraus-Anderson Realty and Development. "We want to be the employer of choice. This office reflects the principles of our company, employees and our clients, and it provides a competitive edge."

Hille also says "the entire design and construction has been very thoughtful, from the building configuration to the air quality, making this an inviting and invigorating environment."

A top priority was a collaborative, open space environment, and using as much daylight as possible including energy efficient LED light fixtures. Indoor air quality featuring low, off-gas emitting characteristics, was also a big priority.

The biggest energy savers KA installed include:

- High efficiency heating and cooling system (Two identical package rooftop variable air volume air handling units with direct expansion cooling and natural gas fired preheating)
- Windows/glazing
- Dimming and daylighting controls
- LED lighting system that is 30 percent more efficient than code
- Occupancy sensor control of office equipment

Finally, the new building includes amenities that previous offices never had: an employee café with large windows to capture ample daylight, a multi-purpose training/conference room, a pre-function break-out space containing a service bar, a catering kitchen, and an employee fitness center with locker rooms. A large outdoor patio located on the 5th floor complete with gas grille -- the perfect spot for staff to enjoy fantastic views of downtown Minneapolis.

And speaking directly to the company's care about sustainability, KA has several remarkable colonies of urban honey bees on the rooftop that are able to live, thrive and pollinate in a bustling downtown urban environment.

Xcel Energy rewarded Kraus-Anderson with rebates and bonuses of more than \$146,000 and will save the company \$80,000 per year in energy costs.

"Saving energy is not the whole answer," Stringfellow says. "Working with Xcel Energy is helping us save energy in a smart way, and new, stricter energy codes are helping achieve that across the industry. Now, instead of asking whether we'll incorporate energy efficiency in our projects, we're taking it upon ourselves to introduce various options and make smart choices." •

Designed by Pope Architects with the support of Orfield Laboratories, Fraser Woodbury will provide a sensory-friendly environment, featuring:

• Enhanced sound attenuation with a quieter mechanical system, higher sound rated walls with acoustic panels and acoustic insulation to minimize mechanical noise distraction;



- Enhanced lighting that reduces shadows and glare for improved transitioning of clients;
- Integrally designed steel structures for attachment of physical therapy equipment in the physical therapy rooms;
- Skylights for natural light in corridors;
- A calming color palette of interior features;
- Window film and exterior screen panels to reduce distractions from outside sources
- Fenced in play area;
- Enhanced door security for added safety.

Kraus-Anderson has deep experience bringing innovative solutions to Minnesota health and education settings, including Regions Hospital Inpatient Mental Health Center in Saint Paul and the Early Childhood Family Center in Stillwater. In addition, KA has built several special education schools, including Karner Blue in Blaine, Pankalo in Lake Elmo, Quora in Little Canada, River Bluff Education Center in Red Wing and Scottish Rite Clinic for Childhood Language Disorders in Duluth. ◆

The design departs from traditional school floor plans by creating pods of learning communities, developing more open and daylit spaces that assist faculty and support the students as they learn life skills of self-regulation, coping, communication, self-efficacy and socialization.

Quora will serve five unique programs for students needing a wide range of services that support them in reaching their educational goals. The open design empowers students to flow through the space, while providing staff the ability to maintain sight and control.

Quora Education Center is the third special education school built for

Northeast Metro 916 by Kraus-Anderson, one of the area's largest construction manager of schools for students with special needs. Others include Karner Blue Education Center. a K-8 school in Blaine, Minn.; and Pankalo Education Center, a K-8 school in Lake Elmo, Minn. 
