Bloomington Ice Garden (BIG)

RJM Construction

Originally opened in 1970 as a single-sheet rink, the Bloomington Ice Garden (BIG) has grown into one of Minnesota's premier ice-skating destinations. Over the decades, the facility expanded to three rinks and now supports more than 10,000 hours of annual ice time, hosting dozens of tournaments and welcoming athletes from across Minnesota, the United States, and Canada.

BIG's history is equally impressive. The facility has hosted some of the sport's biggest names, including Olympic and World Champion Dorothy Hamill, NHL Hall of Famer Wayne Gretzky, the U.S. Figure Skating Championships, and the legendary 1980 "Miracle on Ice" Olympic team. Over the decades, the building expanded with additional rinks, upgraded training spaces, and enhanced amenities to meet the growing needs of skaters and spectators, and years of extensive use understandably took a toll on the facility.

To ensure BIG continues its legacy for the next generation, RJM partnered with the City of Bloomington on a transformative \$37.2 million renovation. The modernization replaced the aging ice plant that relied on environmentally harmful R-22 refrigerant and introduced a new roof, state-of-the-art mechanical systems, and fully updated rink floors. Olympic-sized Rink 3 was converted to NHL standards, an indoor training area was added, and locker rooms, restrooms, and ADA-accessible areas were refreshed and expanded.

Executing this renovation required strong leadership and an exceptionally collaborative team process. Under the guidance of RJM Superintendent Jeff Mauder, the project navigated several "undocumented" additions and a series of unforeseen existing conditions uncovered once walls and floors were opened. These challenges demanded rapid design adjustments, immediate pricing from trade partners, and a high level of trust among the owner, architects, and RJM to evaluate solutions quickly and cost-effectively. The team also demonstrated resourceful problem-solving when frost was discovered beneath Rink 2. With the primary testing agency unable to mobilize for several weeks, RJM swiftly secured an alternate partner capable of completing critical soil temperature testing within days, keeping the project on schedule.

Through carefully phased construction, RJM delivered a "2nd miracle on ice" for the city of Bloomington, all within a planned six-month shutdown, ensuring BIG remains a high-performance, high-impact community asset for years to come.





The Forum *Bauer Design Build*

The Forum is a ground-up, modern, multi-use facility combining flexible office space, a fully equipped fitness center with locker rooms and saunas, and entertainment amenities including four indoor pickleball courts and two golf simulators. Together these elements create a community-focused environment that balances productivity, wellness, and recreation.



Building Trades Credit Union, Shoreview Replacement and Temporary Location *Donlar Construction*

Building Trades Credit Union (BTCU) completed construction of a new branch at its historical location on the corner of Rice and I-694 in Shoreview by the end of 2022. The groundbreaking ceremony was held on May 23, 2022. During the construction, a temporary branch was opened in nearby Little Canada.



United Heroes League - Locker Room/ Warming House & Precast Stadia *Doran Companies*

The United Heroes League Locker Room/Warming House & Precast Stadia in Hastings, Minnesota, provides a dedicated space for youth athletes and military families. The facility includes multiple locker rooms, restrooms, a Zamboni room, and elevated stadia seating. It also supported activities during Hockey Day Minnesota 2026.

Marriott TownePlace Suites - Mankato *Fendler Patterson Construction*

Marriott TownePlace Suites - Mankato is a 95-suite extended-stay hotel featuring modern studio and one-bedroom suites with full kitchens, flexible workspaces, and premium finishes. The project includes a fitness center, indoor pool, outdoor patio with firepit and grill, and all supporting infrastructure, creating a welcoming home base for travelers.



Danny's Construction Multi-Tenant Office Building *Greystone Construction*

Greystone Construction developed and built the 28,700SF office building—an inspiring Class-A, two-story facility featuring mass timber, steel, and design by Tushie Montgomery Architects. Located in Shakopee's thriving Canterbury development, it honors Danny's 50-year legacy and craftsmanship, with the company self-performing the steel erection that defines its "Built Strong" spirit.



Carleton College Class of 1974 Center *Terra Construction*

Carleton College's Class of 1974 Center redefines student wellness with a modern hub for health and counseling. Featuring exam rooms, therapy spaces, pharmacy, and advanced systems, it blends accessibility, privacy, and sustainability. More than a building—it's a lasting commitment to student well-being, designed for generations to thrive.





St. Therese of Corcoran ***CBS Construction Services***

A new full-service senior living campus on 13 acres in Corcoran, MN, designed for inclusion within the emerging town center. CBS Construction Services successfully managed construction and coordinated diverse amenities—including a therapy pool, salon, golf simulator, movie theater, library, wellness center, and chapel—while maintaining quality and schedule.



Vale Apartments ***Doran Companies***

Vale Apartments is a 197-unit, 320,951 SF multifamily redevelopment in Minnetonka, MN. The project transforms a former office complex into a Nordic-inspired residential community featuring alcove, one-, two-, and three-bedroom apartments. Amenities include a fitness center, clubroom, entertainment suite, amenity deck, walking trail surrounding a scenic wetland, and more.



Agralite Electric Cooperative ***Gardner Builders***

Agralite's new 65,000 SF office and shop facility in Benson, MN, replaces their previous building. The project supports Agralite's commitment to the local community, prioritizing local businesses and economic impact while providing a modern, functional workspace that allows employees to continue daily operations safely and efficiently throughout construction.



Black Bear Casino Event Center ***Gardner Builders***

Gardner, LSE Architects, and the FDL Tribal Band expanded the Black Bear Casino event center by 20,000 SF. The project added eight new event rooms, a commercial kitchen, and updated common areas, meeting high demand for space and creating a modern venue to host weddings, banquets, and community gatherings.

Ramsey County Environmental Service Center *McGough*

The Ramsey County Environmental Service Center is a modern, efficient facility that expands access to recycling and waste diversion services. Featuring a drive-through drop-off, reuse room, and educational spaces, it enhances community convenience while promoting environmental stewardship and meeting advanced B3 energy-efficiency standards.



LaunchPad Golf The Meadows *PCL Construction*

LaunchPad Golf The Meadows is a 28,000 SF, 40-suite golf entertainment venue featuring premium finishes, indoor and outdoor dining, VIP suites, and a 243-yard driving range with advanced ball tracking. Built by PCL for the SMSC, it combines innovation, sustainability, and cutting-edge design to redefine golf and entertainment experiences.



CentraCare Sauk Crossing Clinic Expansion *RJM Construction*

Expanding CentraCare's Sauk Crossing campus, this project creates a modern, patient-centered environment that brings advanced orthopedic, neuroscience, rehab, imaging, and surgical services under one efficient footprint. The new facilities enhance care delivery, improve flow, and support the region's future health with a thoughtful, community-driven investment.



Rowe Residences *Roers Companies*

Rowe is a mixed-use community in downtown Victoria that blends high-end design with small-town charm. Developed and built by Roers Companies, the project features 125 luxury apartments and 8,700 SF of retail, distinguished by premium finishes and amenities, including a rooftop SkyLounge, speakeasy, and EV-ready underground parking.



Carleton College Student Housing *Terra Construction*

Carleton College's Student Housing project expands equitable living with new housing at Lilac Hill and Union Street—184 beds in sustainable, Phius-certified spaces. Designed for comfort, community, and cultural programs, these residences advance energy efficiency and quality standards while supporting Carleton's goal of 20% townhouse-style living.





Marvella 2190
Ryan Companies US, Inc.

Marvella 2190 expands the Marvella senior living community with 125 independent living units in Saint Paul's Highland Bridge Development. The 276,000 SF building pairs timeless architecture with modern design, supporting active aging in place within an intergenerational neighborhood full of trails, retail, dining, and green space.



**Mayo Clinic Health Systems -
Mankato Bed Tower Expansion**
The Boldt Company

This landmark project for MCHS - Mankato elevates regional healthcare through a transformative 150,000 SF. vertical bed tower expansion directly over their active surgical suite. This expansion creates 120 new patient beds through state-of-the-art surgical suites, critical care units, and maternity units.

Tartan High School Addition & Renovation *Adolfson & Peterson Construction*

This project included multiple additions and renovations, featuring a new stadium, classroom wing, storm shelter gym, science wing, and new main entrance. The existing gym and locker rooms were transformed into flexible learning spaces and a central atrium with a learning stair.



Mirabelle Ancoats

Mirabelle transformed a historic, fully occupied building into a 2,700 SF restaurant that blends coastal ease with vintage elegance. As the fifth project with Jester Concepts and third with Studio Grey, the renovation reflects trusted partnership, careful planning, and a clear vision brought to life in a tight existing space.



Restoration of Minnesota Governor's Residence *Donlar Construction*

The Minnesota Governor's Residence is a 27 room English Tudor home with seven bedrooms, nine bathrooms, two sleeping porches, and eight fireplaces. The Residence contains 14,706 SF and is located on one acre with a 3,420 SF carriage house and garage storage space. Donlar provided asset preservation restoration from interior, exterior, sitework, MEP and security upgrades.



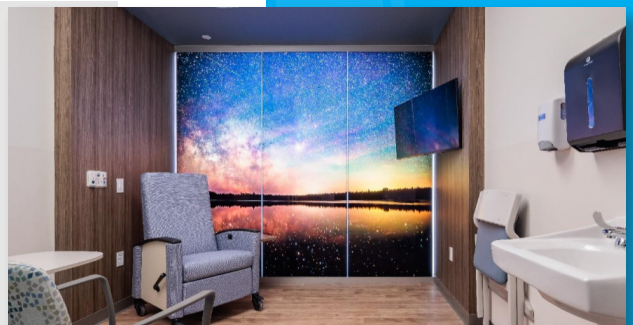
Donaldson Gardner Builders

Fairview Pharmacy Services - Shoreview Seven Lakes Pharmacy *Knutson Construction*

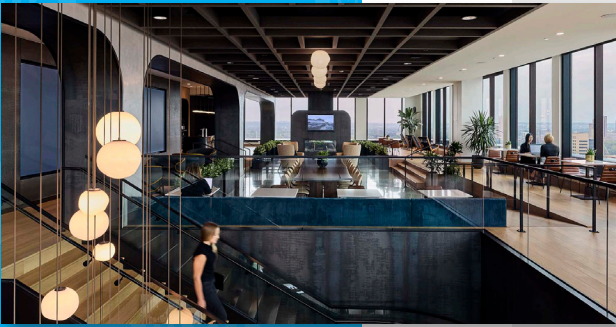
The Seven Lakes Pharmacy in Shoreview houses all departments for Fairview Pharmacy Services, including Specialty, Compounding, Home Infusion, and Integrados. This state-of-the-art facility compounds and distributes necessary medications to all 50 states.





Trillium Woods - Phase 2 Expansion *Kraus-Anderson*

The Trillium Woods - Phase 2 Expansion consisted of a 160,321 SF, five-story expansion with 18 assisted living units, 16 assisted living memory care units, 52 independent living units, and 67 underground parking spaces.



Piper Sandler *McGough*

A high-end corporate office for Piper Sandler located in the North Loop Green building, featuring a trading floor, executive suites, open workspaces, and a rooftop lounge overlooking Target Field. The space blends modern design and performance, reflecting Piper Sandler's identity as a leading investment firm.



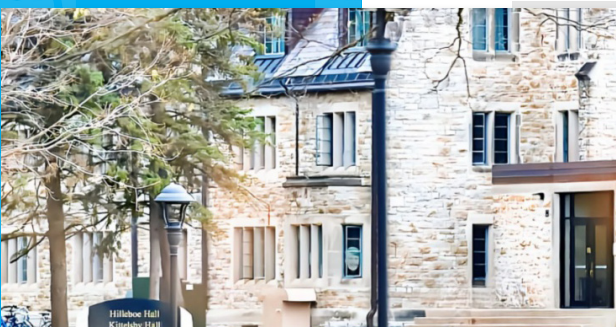
U.S. Bancorp Center Lobby Reno *Red Cedar Steel*

The project remodels the U.S. Bancorp Center's first-floor lobby and second-floor skyway areas, updating vestibules, lobbies, corridors, and vacant spaces. The centerpiece of the project is an eloquent spiral staircase.



Minneapolis Police Station 1st Precinct *Ryan Companies US, Inc.*

The Minneapolis Police Station 1st Precinct renovation transformed a historic building into a modern civic facility through close collaboration with Ryan Companies, Swervo, RSP, and the city. Despite urban site challenges and complex existing conditions, the team delivered this adaptive reuse project on schedule with innovative technology and coordinated planning.



St. Olaf Hillkitt Renovation *The Boldt Company*

Boldt partnered with St. Olaf College to reimagine two adjoining dormitory buildings, transforming them from outdated facilities into vibrant, modern student living environments. The project required complete internal demolition to the structural frame, followed by the installation of state-of-the-art mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems to ensure long-term efficiency and sustainability.

Grant County Law Enforcement Center *Adolfson & Peterson Construction*

The Grant County Law Enforcement Center is a one-story structure with a basement, featuring a masonry exterior, concrete foundations, and wood framing. There are three holding cells incorporated, with a vehicle sallyport, dispatch, and bookings area for the Sheriff's department. A geothermal system was installed as part of this project.



City of Saint Paul North End Community Center *Donlar Construction*

The North End Community Center is a 25,000 SF building featuring numerous state-of-the-art and sustainable amenities. Sustainable features include a geothermal well field for heating/cooling, a roof-mounted solar array for energy generation, and an underground system for stormwater management with a capacity of 1,000,000 gallons. The building utilizes Cross Laminated Timber beams.



Byllesby Dam Water to Wire Hydroelectric Project *The Boldt Company*

Boldt successfully transformed a century-old hydroelectric facility by demolishing the original 1910 powerhouse, removing outdated equipment, and constructing a modern powerhouse equipped with two new Voith turbines. The project included installation of stop logs, a cofferdam, all site civil works, and high-voltage electrical systems, ensuring reliable energy generation.





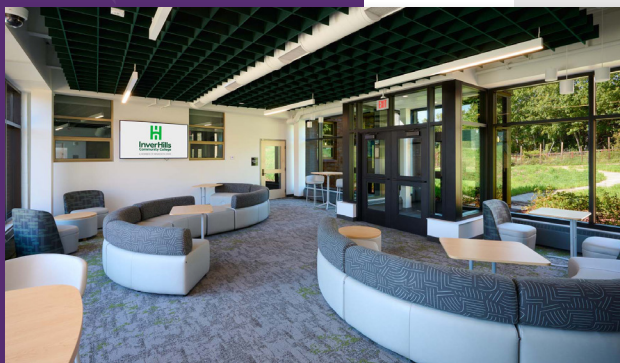
All Seasons Arena Renovations *Knutson Construction*

The All Seasons Arena Renovation exemplifies collaboration and innovation, delivering enhanced community spaces and modernized infrastructure. Through strategic planning and teamwork, the team overcame complex challenges to achieve excellence in quality and schedule. This project reflects Knutson's commitment to creating lasting value for Mankato and its residents.



Washington County Central Service Center *Kraus-Anderson*

The two-story, 31,375 SF Washington County Central Service Center is the first fully mass timber building in the county and one of the first in the state, with beams spanning 54 feet over the central atrium and a solar roof. The structure is built for efficiency, durability, sustainability and engagement.



Inver Hills Community College Technology and Business Building Renovation *McGough*

A complete renovation of the Technology and Business Building at Inver Hills Community College, featuring a new roof, enhanced exterior waterproofing, modernized interiors, and a link connecting Heritage Hall. The project introduced new light monitors and structural upgrades to create a brighter, more functional environment for students and faculty.



Maple Grove Community Center Renovation & Expansion *RJM Construction*

The Maple Grove Community Center Expansion transformed a vital community hub with a new ice arena, team spaces, and a modern lobby—all delivered through phased construction while maintaining full operations. The project team's innovation, precision, and collaboration created a state-of-the-art facility that elevates recreation and strengthens community engagement.

Hansen Cabinets 2.0: Fully Automated Manufacturing Facility *Fendler Patterson Construction*

Hansen Cabinets 2.0 is a 92,000 SF, next-generation manufacturing facility built to house one of North America's most advanced automated cabinet production lines. With seven robotics systems and a 400% capacity increase, the project showcases groundbreaking innovation in American manufacturing and commercial construction.



Bruce Vento Elementary School *RJM Construction*

The newly constructed SPPS Bruce Vento Elementary leads the way in environmental education and immersive learning. Replacing the 50-year-old building, this modern facility serves as an enhanced community hub for students. Honoring Congressman Vento, the state-of-the-art school features geo-exchange systems, rooftop solar energy, and repurposed timber from the original structure.



Carleton College Phius Certified Student Housing *Terra Construction*

Carleton College's Student Housing project expands equitable living with new housing at Lilac Hill and Union Street—184 beds in sustainable, Phius-certified structures. Designed for comfort, community, and cultural programs, these residences advance energy efficiency and quality standards while supporting Carleton's goal of 20% townhouse-style living.



The Standard at Dinkytown *Wells*

This housing project showcases a prefabricated building facade system that delivered speed, budget certainty and bold architectural character. Offsite fabrication, integrated windows and insulation, and efficient installation allowed the team to meet a tight occupancy deadline while achieving a dynamic facade and reducing construction risk on a constrained urban site.





Sick Inc. HQ Expansion - Phase II *Empirehouse, Inc.*

Empirehouse designed, engineered, and installed high-performance glazing for Sick Inc.'s HQ campus expansion, including precision curtain walls, pre-glazed units, and an all-glass skybridge. The work enabled a sustainable, state-of-the-art headquarters that drives collaboration, advanced R&D, and innovation—showcasing Empirehouse's expertise in delivering complex, high-performance building envelope solutions.



Denver International Airport – Phase 2 of the Great Hall *Grazzini Brothers & Company*

Grazzini Brothers' scope entailed the installation of over 75,000 SF of large format quartz tile. Work was completed on both Ticketing Level 6 and Baggage Claim Level 5. All work completed was a remodel of existing spaces into a new TSA Checkpoint on Level 6 and new escalator areas.



Sick Inc. Bloomington *Infinity Scaffold*

Infinity Scaffold designed, installed, and dismantled a large-scale, multi-level scaffold system in the expansive atrium of the new Sick Inc. Bloomington Campus. The adaptable design supported multiple trades simultaneously. It provided full perimeter and ceiling access for finishing work on structural beams, sky lights, and slab edges.

The Essentia Health St. Mary's Hospital Demolition Project encompassed the safe abatement, demolition, site restoration of a 12-story, 648,000 SF facility in downtown Duluth. Highlights included environmental remediation, removal of three skywalks & a 110-foot chimney, followed by backfill, new utilities, lighting, landscape restoration, and transforming an entire city block for future redevelopment.

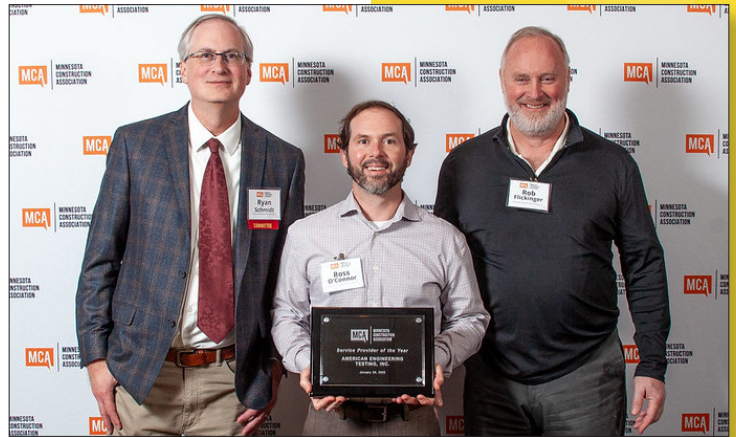
